Park Rules

To protect our beautiful parks and to make your park visit more enjoyable, it is unlawful for any person to do any of the following in the parks:

- × To ride, drive or park any vehicle or horse on the grass.
- × Damage any property or plants in the parks.
- × To pick or cut any wild or cultivated flower.
- × To litter on the grounds.
- × To use loud or obscene language.
- × To disturb animals found in the parks.
- × To wash vehicles in the parks
- × To consume beer, wine, or other alcoholic beverages in the park
- × Pets must be on a leash (except in designated dog park). Animal waste must be picked up and disposed of in a trash container.

Weddings and Other Special Uses of Parks

Anyone wanting to reserve a location in a Park for weddings or other events must have approval by the Parks Superintendent. The daily fee is \$75.00. If use of the park will include a tent, bounce house, etc provided by the renter, the fee will be \$125.00. The exact location of the tent must be approved by the Parks Superintendent to avoid damage to underground utilities.
